Course description	Within the scope of this course, students develop their language skills on levels C1/C2. They continue improving their speaking skills needed for interactive communication and learn about the cultural norms of the English-speaking countries. Also, students are encouraged to express their personal attitudes in a more complex way and discuss various contemporary topics, so that they develop their argumentation strategies and critical thinking. Furthermore, the focus is on achieving high standards in students' receptive and productive skills. Students translate various texts, thus acquiring basic translation techniques. While translating, they are encouraged to use different sources and make their own glossaries. Students complete their knowledge of basic grammatical and lexical structures by analysing shorter texts and translations, which enables further development of skills for individual work and learning.
