Conditions for permission to take the exam	The midterm exams are mandatory and a compulsory condition in formation of the final grade. Grades of midterm exams may be negative. In the event of a negative grade, student will take the final oral exam, which will include the teaching/learning material that was negatively graded in midterm exam/-s. In the event of an excused absence from the midterm exam, the same obligation is foreseen as in the case of receiving a negative grade from the midterm exam. Students will consult course instructor about the choice of topic(s) and literature required for the preparation of a seminar paper. The seminar paper must be submitted by the end of classes in the winter semester. Regular attendance of classes means presence at 80% of the teaching hours. In case of schedule overlaps (collisions) in dual degree programs, the student is required to attend 40% of each of the courses that are held at the same time.

Course description	The course provides insight into: the area of linguistics in which the phraseology is both theoretically and pragmatically founded and applied (lexicology, lexical research, lexical semantics, phraseological research); the basic features of phraseological units and their classification, in their characteristics and potentials of creating texts with PUs as constituent elements of the text; in understanding the context and its interpretation with the help of phraseological units; in the functions of language with phraseological units; the basic procedures and techniques of translating phraseological units in both directions and in the phraseological units from other areas where the English language is a standard variety of language (e.g. American English).
